

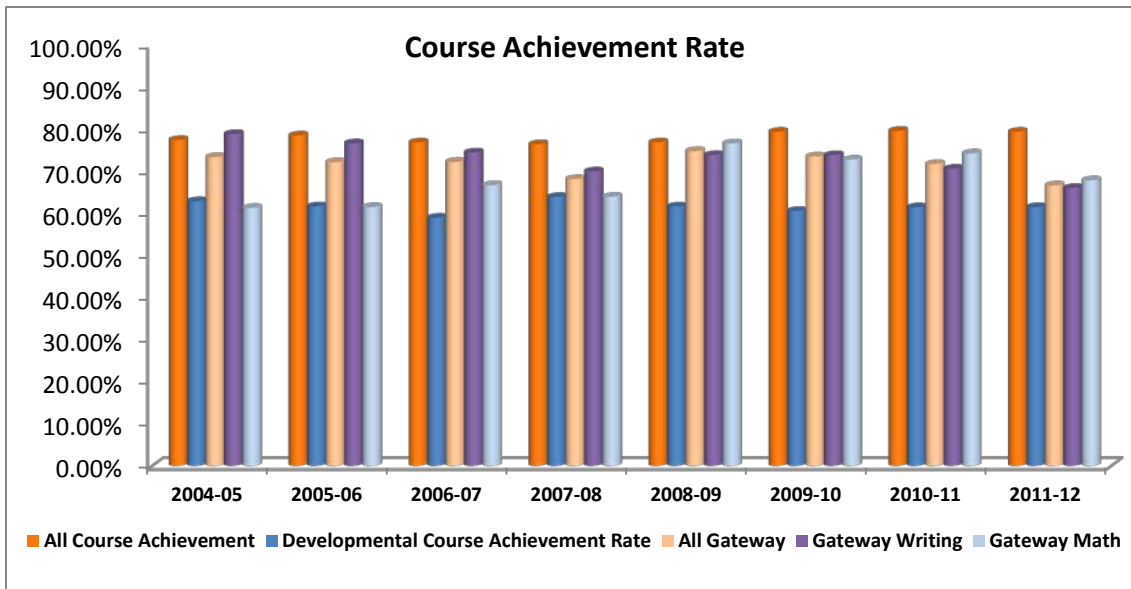


Course Achievement Brief



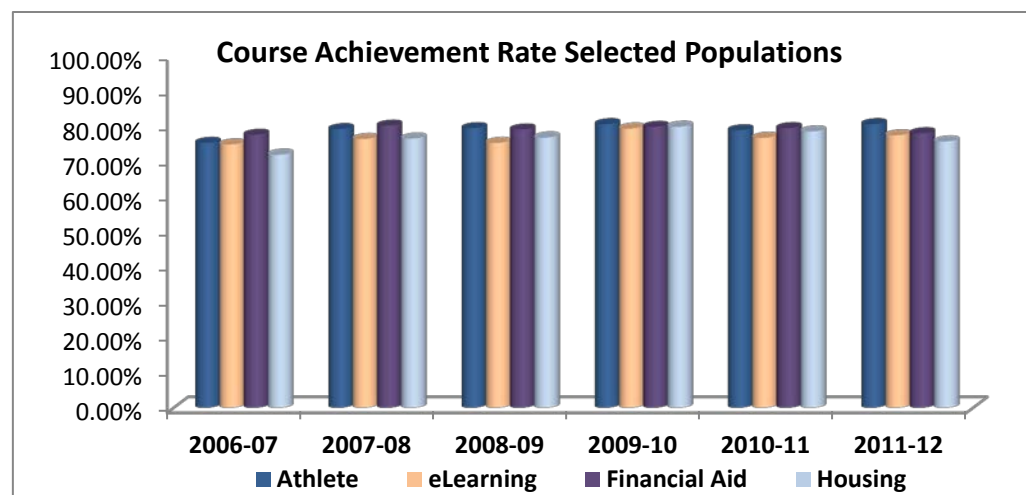
STUDENT SUCCESS

Students who attended credit courses at Southwestern successfully passed their courses approximately 77% of the time. Students enrolled in the developmental courses had the lowest completion rates, while students in gateway courses such as math and writing had a significantly better completion rate. In the academic year of 2011-12, the rates were within 5% points for developmental and gateway courses. In the past three academic years all course achievement rates have remained consistently above 79%.



SUCCESS GAPS

There is a significant disparity between all course completion and all gateway course completion rates with all developmental courses. Completion rates are over 10% higher in most years for all courses and all gateway courses.



In the past academic year, 2011-12, the all course achievement rate was at 79.37% while the developmental course achievement rate was at 61.47%.

eLearning and housing students complete courses at a comparable rate to all students while athletes and financial aid students consistently perform about 3% better than all students.

ABOUT THIS DATA: Successful completion is defined as the percentage of students who enroll and earned a grade of "A," "B," "C," or "P," "R," or "S".
