Overview

Graduation Rates Overview

Welcome to the IPEDS Graduation Rates (GR) survey component. The GR component collects data on the cohort of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students and tracks their completion status at 150% of the normal time to complete all requirements of their program of study. This information is collected to assist institutions in complying with the requirements of the Student Right-to-Know Act.

Data Reporting Reminders

Once a student is in the cohort, they remain in the cohort, even if their status changes to part-time or they drop out or transfer out of the institution. However, adjustments can be made to the cohort for allowable exclusions, which include the death of a student, permanent disability, military deployment, or service on an official church mission or with a foreign aid service of the Federal government.

 When reporting award levels for sub-baccalaureate certificates, determine program length by the number of credit or contact hours, NOT the academic year length in parentheses. The academic year length is meant only to provide context.

Graduation Rates - Establishing cohort

Graduation Rates - Transfers/exclusions

- Report transfers-out who did not complete a program in Column 30. Reason:	The college set a priority in 2012 to focus on student success and completion including joining Achieving the Dream, awarding of grants to support student completion (TAACCT) and increased faculty interaction for early intervention for students who appeared to need additional academic support. These initiatives have led to increased student success at the developmental course level, gateway course completion, one-year retention rates increasing over 8% and increased graduation rates.
