
Southwestern Oregon Community College ATD Achievement Overview: 2013

There are four measures in the ATD 2015 Annual Reflection report. In all cases, Southwestern increased student success compared to the prior year or was nearly the same.


Successfully complete postsecondary remedial Math or Writing within 2 years (one measure) and students who
enroll in and complete gateway courses within 3 years (second measure)— the ATD data indicates the following
percentages based on students in the 2011 cohort (measured for three years starting in 2011-12 through 201314):

a. Math PSR: 18%b. Math Gateway: 11%c. Writing PSR: 38%d. Writing Gateway: 39%


The writing success rates for increased over 6 percentage points from the 2009 cohort in both PSR and gateway while the Math PSR rate increased 5 percentage points. There was no change in the Math gateway rate. All students are represented in the graph below.



• Gateway Math Success Rate for 2013 was 69%, an increase of 10 percentage points over 2011




The gateway Writing course success rate was over 72% in 2013-14 representing an increase of over 13 percentage points from 2011 and over 5 percentage points from 2012.




• Year to Year Retention Rate (third measure): Students were retained for one year at a rate of nearly 61% for 2013-14 representing an Increase of over 11 percentage points from 2011 and 5 percentage points from 2012.

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• Graduation Rates (fourth measure): The graduation rate was 22% as reported to IPEDS for the 2011 cohort, an increase of 3 percentage points from 2012 and the highest reported over the last four years.



The full-time student persistence rate for first-time students for fall to winter term and fall to spring terms reached a four-year high at over 92% (fall to winter) and over 81% (fall to spring) in 2013-14.

The part-time student (6 – 11 credits) persistence rate for first-time students for fall to winter term was over 64% while the fall to spring term reached a four-year high at over 53% in 2013-14.
