Welcome to the Student Financial Aid (SFA) component. The purpose of the SFA component is to collect information about financial aid provided to various groups of undergraduate students and military/veteran educational benefits for all students at your institution.

**Data Reporting Reminders**

**Undergraduate Student Groups**

You will be asked to report information for different groups of students.

- **Group 1:** All undergraduate students
- **Group 2:** Of Group 1, full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking students (FTFT)
- **Group 3:** Of Group 2, FTFT students who paid the in-state/in-district tuition rate and were awarded any grant/scholarship aid from the federal government, state/local government, or the institution
- **Group 4:** Of Group 2, FTFT students who paid the in-state/in-district tuition rate and were awarded any Title IV federal student aid



\*For public institutions, include only those students paying the in-state or in-district tuition rate. For program reporters, include only those students enrolled in the institution's largest program.

**COA Revisions**

Revisions to Cost of Attendance (COA) used to calculate the net price of attendance can be made in this component.

Consult the instructions and screens to make sure you are reporting the correct aid amounts for the correct groups of students.

**College Affordability and Transparency Lists**

Net price amounts calculated in SFA will be used to populate the U.S. Department of Education's College Affordability and Transparency lists.

**Interactive Edits and Error Messages**

SFA contains interactive edits that will check for blank fields, invalid values, or values that fall outside expected ranges. Some error messages will require you to confirm or explain the values that you entered. 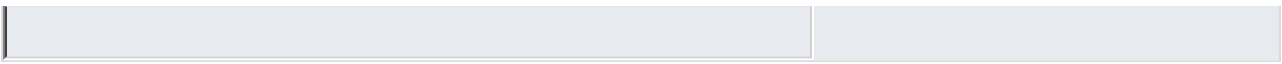

Reason:	We have little control over our private loans, and are only served by two lenders. The amount students borrow fluctuates quite a bit with each year and with private companies actually offering better interest rates than the DOE, we are going to see this continue to increase.

Reason:	It looks like this is a trend for us as noted in 13-14 and 15-16. A large majority of our students fit into this category as well as the 30-48k category, so the majority of our students are low income. The Pell and State grants have not increased with inflation, so we continue to see disparities in this group.

Reason:	It appears that, similar to 2013-2014, our low income students are getting less aid overall to cover costs. Continuing cost increases in tuition, fees and student housing contribute to this variance.

Reason:	Based on the data from prior years, this particular income level fluctuates significantly. Looking at the specific data, the awards that make up this group are predominantly institutional aid given for athletics or merit. It is such a small group that any changes would impact the average more than some of the larger groups like the \$0-\$30,000. The awards are predominantly tuition waivers, and the tuition increased \$2 per credit over the prior year.
