#### **Graduation Rates Overview**

Welcome to the IPEDS Graduation Rates (GR) survey component. The GR component collects data on the cohort of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students and tracks their completion status at 150% of the normal time to complete all requirements of their program of study. This information is collected to assist institutions in complying with the requirements of the Student Right-to-Know Act.

#### **Data Reporting Reminders**

- Once a student is in the cohort, they remain in the cohort, even if their status changes to part-time or they drop out or transfer out of the institution. However, adjustments can be

#### Establishing cohorts - Gender Unknown or Another Gender than Provided Categories

Reason Our transfer out rates for 2021-22 were incorrect due to processes that may not have updated all data correctly during COVID. While the 2021-22 GR transfer data were updated within the correction period, evidence suggests the error may have begun during 2020-21, subsequent to staff turnover. In addition, we anticipate that enrollment and transfer patterns for students who were enrolled between 2019-20 and 2021-22 may continue to be erratic due to COVID-19. The current transfer our data have been verified through data provided by National Student Clearinghouse.
