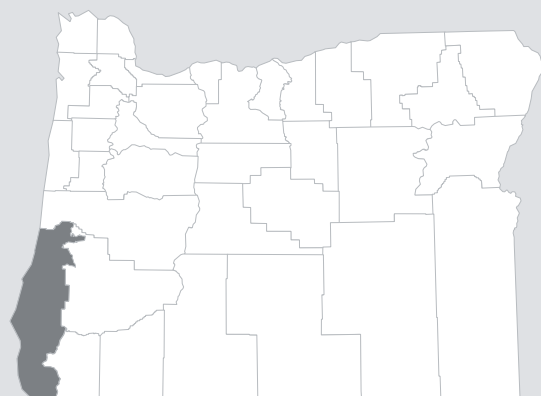

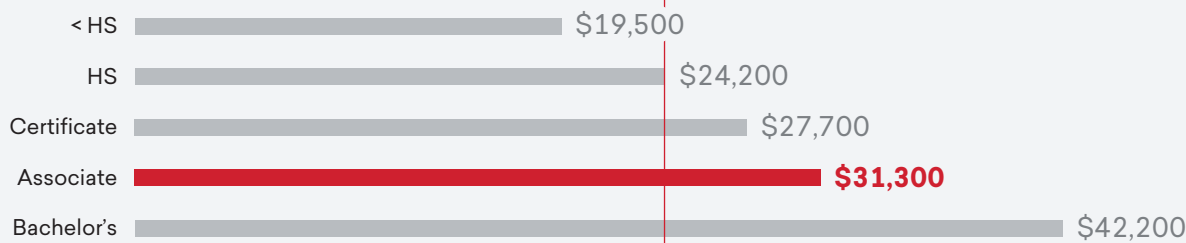

INVESTMENT ANALYSIS
